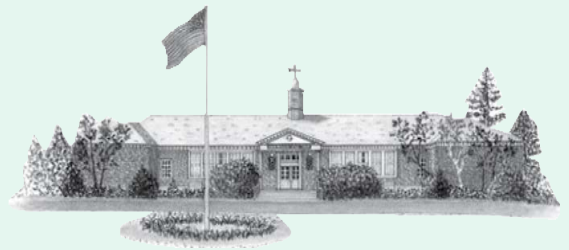

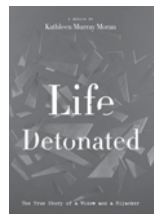


Life Detonated

The True Story of a Widow and a Hijacker

Join local author, Kathleen Murray Moran for a book talk and signing. Ms. Murry holds a BA in Journalism and MA in English from SUNY Stony Brook, and taught writing and literature at Suffolk Community College for twenty-five years. She is co-founder of Survivors of the Shield (SOS) and helped to pass legislation that protects pension benefits, provides full scholarships, and was instrumental in creating a four-year scholarship to St. John's University.
